Stage Manner



- Chair or the emcees before you use the microphone unless it is your turn and invited. (Otherwise ask, "May I have the privilege of using the mike for a few seconds?")
- Don't forget to thank the Chair or the emcees for the opportunity before you resume your seat after the use of the mike.
- Only the Presiding Officer
- has the privilege to address everyone on the stage individually.
- Others must address the Presiding Officer alone and others in general-combinely. ("..and other friends,")
- Minimize or better avoid drawing the attention of the Chair, especially from behind, during the course of the functions.

- Be a miser in the use of words and quit the lectern as early as possible - don't wait for any note, directing you to spare the mike and withdraw, (a' KISS' note)
- When somebody is honoured on the stage or a photo of your neighbour on the stage is taken, it is courtious to stand up along with him.
- When thanked, you must be on the stage, rise up from the seat and acknowledge the expression of gratitude with folded hands or the right hand raised or with a bow.
- During the singing of our National Anthem, we must be on the stage, standing with rapt attention facing the flag, if there is one. (No kind of talking; not even whispering.)
